## Improving Organizational Relationships Between Campuses

**Whereas**, Santa Rosa Junior College is a single college multi-campus district with campuses in Santa Rosa and Petaluma; and

**Whereas**, a campus has a specific definition by the Chancellor's office which differentiates it from a site; and

**Whereas**, Santa Rosa Junior College has determined that both campuses will be served by single departments; and

**Whereas**, there are organizational and operational disparities between the two campuses; and

**Whereas**, these disparities often result in workload inequities and an exclusion of Petaluma faculty from departmental activities, meetings, planning and resources; and

**Whereas**, the AFA and the Academic Senate have completed their joint task force survey of faculty regarding relationships between the two campuses and the results are currently being analyzed; and

**Be It Resolved**, that the Academic Senate for Santa Rosa Junior College urges the AFA and the district to use those results to inform them in negotiations regarding the organizational and operational structure of the two campuses; and

**Be It Resolved**, that the Academic Senate for Santa Rosa Junior College urges the AFA and the district, in consultation with department chairs and Petaluma faculty, to negotiate to equitably resolve multi-campus issues; and

**Be It Resolved,** that the Academic Senate for Santa Rosa Junior College and AFA will review this Resolution and any contract language pertaining to multi-campus issues in the event that an additional campus be added to the district.
