Academic Senate and Board of Trustees

After much difficulty, we finally have meetings scheduled for the Academic Senate Executive team to meet with Trustees. Two meetings will occur in December, covering 4 of the 7 trustees, and we hope to meet with the rest as well, very shortly. The purpose of these meet4ings is to educate the Board on the 10 plus 1, the role of the senate in institutional decision making according to Ed. Code and Title 5, and to have conversations about issues including Senate Primacy--where and how it does or should apply; faculty hiring, and equivalency. I'm sure we'll also talk about Guided Pathways.

Goal Survey Results (attached)
