- From FAQs (link above): How is the Online College different from the OEI? The Online Education Initiative (OEI) is focused on traditional college students. OEI established a technological infrastructure to expand online offerings at all 114 community colleges, built services to support students taking online courses, and established a Course Exchange to allow students to seamlessly enroll in online courses within six currently participating colleges. In serving traditional students, OEI focuses on serving the transfer needs of students, such as building out the Associate Degree for Transfer pathways, as well as creating online classes for bottleneck gateway courses required to transfer. The new online college will offer programs for working adults who are not currently accessing higher education and need wage gain and promotional opportunities.
