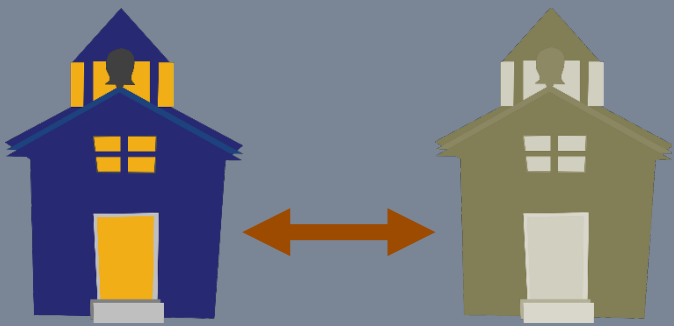


Statewide Course Exchange



What is the Course Exchange?



- Students take online classes from other CCCs
- CVC-OEI (Calif. Virtual Campus-Online Education Initiative)
- Grant funded to expand and improve online course offerings
- 2014-2018: Tried to create exchange software and policies
- 2018: Grant renewed with new 3rd-party software
- 3 Colleges are piloting new software now
- Students will use the Finish Faster Online website to register and pay for classes

Course Reviews

*(Quality
Reviewed badge)*



- New agreement sets target of 20% of all online classes reviewed – individual faculty can opt in
- Reviews are based on the Course Design Rubric and the @ONE Standards for Quality Online Teaching
- The standards are based on work done by @ONE, the CCC Academic Senate, and the CCC Chancellor's office, and more
- Aspects of the review are related to course design, interaction and collaboration, assessment, learner support, and accessibility
- Course reviews are not evaluative of subject matter materials

Course Reviews (cont.)

- Course reviews are not tied to any faculty evaluations
- Courses are not compared across colleges, and there is no intention to “homogenize” courses or materials
- Reviews are intended to ensure that classes in the Course Exchange are of the highest possible quality and lead to the greatest levels of student success
- Course reviews are done by trained faculty peers
- Work needed to improve a course based on review results is done by the instructor, but a team of instructional designers and accessibility specialists is available to provide assistance

Students at non-Consortium colleges can still enroll in Exchange courses, but...

Non-Consortium-College Students

- Have to fill out an application to each college at which they want to enroll in classes
- Are typically unable to bundle financial aid for courses they take at their home and other institutions
- Would be required to request final grades from other colleges be transferred to their home college

Consortium-College Students

- Can enroll in (and pay for) online classes at other Consortium colleges without an additional application
- Can enroll in up to 2 online classes (per term) at Consortium colleges regardless of financial aid status
- Will automatically have the grades reflected from online classes at other Consortium colleges on their home college transcript (*future*)

- **In May and June of 2019**
 - 3 SRJC students applied for SRJC classes
 - 9 SRJC students completed applications to enroll in 9 classes at 7 other California community colleges
 - Same partnership with UCs and CSUs planned for summer 2020, including marketing campaign

Should we consider joining the Course Exchange?

Advantages

- CCC students can easily sign up for our classes
- Students could keep fin. aid by finding additional classes
- Adv. classes with low enrollment may be kept open (win for student, college and faculty)
- Our students still count as “completers”
- Might increase enrollments
- Courses will be heavily promoted by the CVC-OEI
- Consortium colleges receive a variety of free and subsidized resources (NetTutor, Proctorio, etc.)
- Colleges and/or classes will receive additional accessibility support and PD opportunities

Challenges

- Applicants to the Consortium must get multi-constituency college agreement (faculty, mgmt., AS, Financial Aid, DE, IT)
- Applicants to the Consortium must sign a Federal Financial Aid Agreement
- SRJC will need to find a way to have 20% of their online classes reviewed, possibly make changes, and then receive “badges” which will promote search ranking (reviewed classes do 4.9% better in student success than non-reviewed)
- Colleges in the exchange may lose enrollments to other colleges (the intent is to promote equity across colleges and support student completion and success)

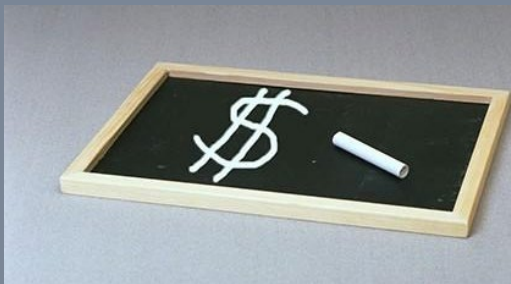
National data shows



- Nearly 53 percent of students who took at least one online course in 2016 also enrolled in a physical class.
- Many students still want access to on-campus resources due to local connections.
- The opportunity to switch between a physical classroom and online learning may also be a big factor in the general appeal of local online degree programs.

How would joining the Consortium affect our Funding Formula?



- FTES from enrollments of students from other colleges in our courses
- SRJC would receive the “completions” for SRJC students in courses at other colleges
- Even more funding is given if students complete CE programs, which are heavily online at SRJC

Things to Think About



- Whether or not we join the Consortium and participate in the Course Exchange, our students (like all CCC students) are becoming more aware of the availability of online courses at other CCCs and elsewhere.
- Our Counselors routinely recommend taking online classes elsewhere when we don't offer them or they are full.
- We don't yet have any data showing how many of our students take classes at other CCCs, but anecdotally we know that they do .

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
