Integrated Student Success Committee (ISSC)

- ISCC is a shared governance committee that was officially established in spring 2017.
- The Committee provides a (shared governance) platform for collaboration and communication across the District to advance equitable student access, success, and completion at Santa Rosa Junior College.
- Committee Composition: 13 faculty (12 appointed by Academic Senate &1 by AFA), 10 administrators, 4 classified staff members, & 4 students.
- Academic Senate President (or designee) is a co-chair of ISSC







- ISCC Recognizes and honors 10+1 (shared governance).
- ISCC reviews the SEA program budget requests/changes and makes formal recommendations as a shared governance committee.
- Ongoing, consistent communications (via monthly check-in meetings) occur between Academic Senate President and ISSC Co-chairs.
- The Student Equity Plan (a requirement of the SEA program) is presented to Academic Senate and other Shared Governance bodies for input, discussion, and approval.
- Annual SEA Program Outcome Reports are shared with Academic Senate and College Community.



ISSC Program Evaluations

- SEA-funded programs undergo an annual evaluation supported by the Office of Institutional Research.
- ISSC reviews the data for program effectiveness and is tasked to make recommendations.
- Ongoing discussions determine future priorities based on SEA Program requirements and student needs.





Student Equity & Achievement Program (SEA) Program Requirements (Ed Code 78222b):

As a condition of the receipt of funds for purposes of this section, a district shall comply with all of the following:

- Maintain a student equity plan pursuant to Section 78220 to ensure equal educational opportunities and to promote student success for all students, regardless of race, gender, age, disability, or economic circumstances.
- 2. **Provide matriculation services** (orientation, counseling and advising, referral to specialized student support services, and other education planning services needed to assist a student in making informed decisions about his or her educational goal and course of study and in developing an education plan).
- 3. Adopt and implement AB 705
- 4. Provide all non-exempt* students with an education plan
