Sources and Parameters

Q6. Unduplicated Headcount. We are using the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office DataMart, Annual/Term Student Count Report. In prior years the source has been SRJC OIR SIS Query, which included students with less than 8 hours of attendance. The SRJC Fact Book was not used due to only 4 years of data and the visualization used to review trends displays 10 years of data.

Q7. Total unduplicated headcount enrollment in degree applicable credit courses. We are using internal SRJC data (SRJC OIR SIS Query ACCJC Annual Report) to extract only degree applicable

courses (OIR SIS credit status =2) with a 'grade final' selected.

- Q8. Total unduplicated headcount distance education enrollment. Using internal SRJC data (SRJC OIR SIS Query ACCJC Annual Report), online/distance education parameters are selected without the filter of degree applicable credit courses.
- Q13. Course Completion Rates. Using data derived from SRJC Fact Book, Credit Course Grades visualization and selecting "All" in semester for each "Academic Year" for 2019 annual reports. For prior years the source was the Student Success Scorecard. We were not able to provide the actual "Course Completion Rates" for 2018-19 as a measure of student achievement data because the Accountability Reporting for the Community Colleges (ARCC) data files for that academic year were not available at the time of this report.
- Q14. Certificates. SRJC Fact Book, Degrees and Certificates visualization, selecting "16" for "Units (certificates.)" Prior years report included 12+ units which resulted in a larger number of certificates. We were not able to provide the actual "Certificates" for 2018-19 as a measure of student achievement data because the Accountability Reporting for the Community Colleges (ARCC) data files for that academic year were not available at the time of this report.
- Q15. Degrees. SRJC Fact Book, Degrees and Certificates. We were not able to provide the actual "Degrees" for 2018-19 as a measure of student achievement data because the Accountability Reporting for the Community Colleges (ARCC) data files for that academic year were not available at the time of this report.
- Q17. Transfers. The total is a combination of SRJC students enrolled at UC, CSU, In State Private (ISP) and Out Of State (OOS) Colleges/Universities. We used the data provided through California Community College Chancellor's Office DataMart to get the ISO and OOS transfers. The UC data is from the University of California statistics webpage and the CSU is from the Corresponding California State University webpage. We were not able to provide the actual "Transfer" for 2018-19 as a measure of student achievement data because the data set from these various sources was incomplete at the time of this report.
- Q19. Job Placement Rates. We are calculating the percentage of CTE completers employed in their field of study, using those who report being in the labor market as the denominator. Data come from the annual CTE Employment Outcomes Survey. We calculate the percentages using the following parameters:
- 1. For CTE programs (certificates and degrees) where we award 10+ in a year; and
- 2. We have reliable data available, which we define as 3+ cases from the CTE Outcomes Survey; and
- 3. Where the percentage of students who are either employed or seeking employment are employed in a job that is closely related to their field of study.

The data included in this report are certified as a complete and accurate representation of the reporting institution.

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
