Fall 2024 Legislative Highlights

- Met SRJC Local General Education Updates re: Title 5, mandated alignments, and areas of local decision making (including but not limited to) ...

 Area 8 Student Success & Wellness [each three units]

 - Adapted Physical Education Disciplines List Changes (and adopted statewide by ASCCC in Spring 2025)
- Established Senate taskforces for developing recommendations regarding:
 - Generative Artificial Intelligence (GenAI) and including the referral of a proposed resolution on GenAI to the forthcoming district taskforce*
 - updating our Bylaws and Constitution
 - revitalizing the senate's faculty professional development subcommittee
 - reapportioning our Areas of Representation*

Spring 2025 Legislative Highlights

- Recommended a permanent Student Learning Outcomes (SLO) Assessment Committee
- Established an online teaching certification workgroup
- Decided *not* to adopt exemptions to local AA, GE patterns
- Referred GenAI taskforce recommendations to EPCC for deeper policy development
- Approved use of Senate funds for sending up to three faculty to ASCCC Spring 2025
 Plenary (to accompany President Stover)
- Recommended faculty include one of four sample syllabus statements offered by the GenAl workgroup (as based on ASCCC recommendations) specific to GenAl use in the classroom
- Reintroduced AP 7120A (Contract) Faculty Hiring for formal consideration by the body
 - Aligned with AP2410 process already underway
 - Reintroduced in regular session April 30th
 - Special Study Session held May 21st



Spring 2025 Legislative Highlights

CONSENT ITEMS PASSED

- S25 Cal-GETC Ethnic Studies Resolution
 - Resolved, That Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC) work with ICAS to develop and implement a policy, effective Fall 2026, that any California Community College (CCC) ethnic studies course that is articulated to any California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) course approved for ethnic studies general education and/or graduation requirements, be "automatically" approved for Cal-GETC Area 6.
- Extension of "Proctorio" license (online proctoring software) through June of 2026
- Recommended work concerning GenAI policies and procedures to the forthcoming District Wide GenAI Taskforce
- Regular and Substantive Interaction (RSI) Resolution
- Name Coach Software Adoption

Looking Ahead [AY2025 – 2026]: Summer Retreats

- Occurring (Monday) July 14th and (Wednesday) July 23rd
 - Longer-term planning now possible that structural, administrative, and leadership roles are clearly defined and supported
