OVERVIEW

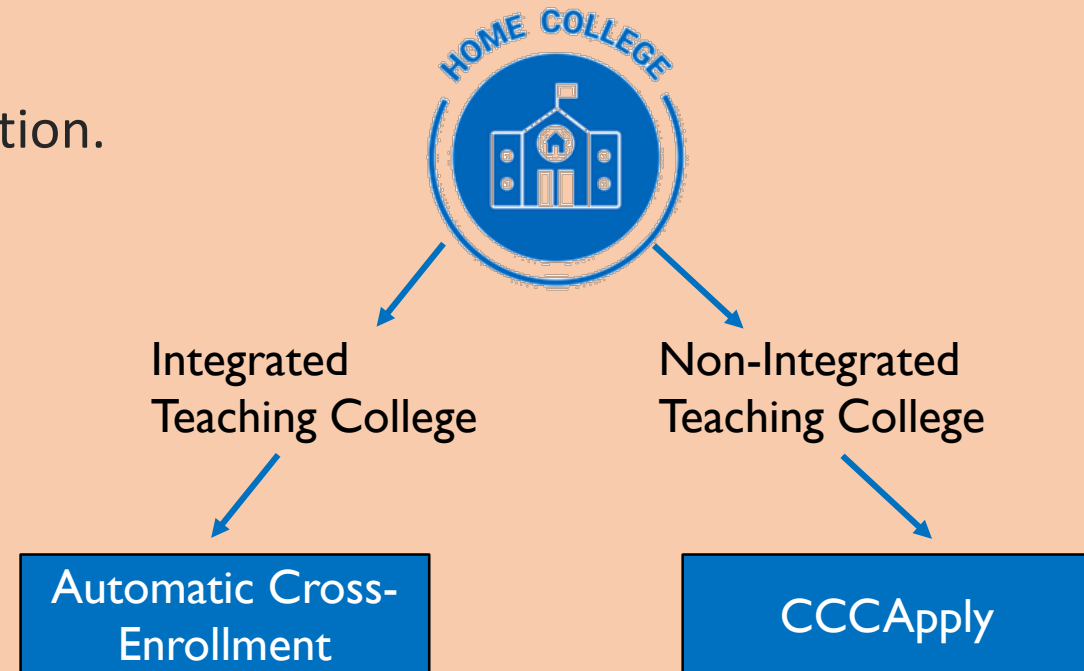
- The California Virtual Campus (CVC) Exchange is a collaborative effort among CCCs to ensure that more **students are able to complete their educational goals** by increasing both access to and success in online courses.
- The Exchange allows students to **instantly enroll in online courses** at eligible colleges without additional documentation, processes and repeated effort.
- Courses can be searched by CSU Breadth, IGETC, substitute course, keyword or subject, and include **real-time seat counts**.
- **Financial aid requests and academic transcripts** are automatically transferred between colleges.
- Students' Canvas dashboards will reflect all enrolled courses within the CCC system.

DEFINITIONS

- **Home College:** College that has completed a set of technical steps to enable students to cross-enroll into courses offered at other CCCs.
- **Teaching College:** College that completed a deeper technical integration allowing students from other CCCs to enroll without additional applications.
- **Consortium College:** Group of colleges that have committed to implementing the CVC Exchange by signing a master agreement and committing to data sharing, financial aid agreements, setting up a POCR process, and other technical elements.
- **Cross-Enrollment:** Process that allows students from Home Colleges to enroll in online classes at Teaching Colleges without filling out a separate application.

HOW IT WORKS

- All online classes in the CCC system currently appear in the CVC.edu listing. However, as of Jan. 1, courses from colleges that have not enabled special software will not appear in any searches.
- SRJC could become a Home College or both a Home and Teaching College
- As a Home College
 - SRJC student can enroll “instantly” in a class at a Teaching College (23 currently) without a new application.
 - SRJC would get credit for any completions
- As a Teaching College
 - Students from another Home College (80 currently) can enroll “instantly” in an SRJC online class
 - SRJC could increase enrollment/FTES
 - SRJC could fill advanced or hard-to-fill classes



WHAT WOULD BE THE ADVANTAGES OF JOINING THE EXCHANGE?

- Overall **enrollments** could increase if we become a Teaching College.
- **Completion rates** (part of the SCFF) could increase as our students are credited as completers when taking courses from other colleges.
- Expanding the Exchange makes it **easier for students to be successful** by increasing their access to courses that may be unavailable at their own college.
- SRJC would **participate in conversations/decisions** about the Exchange.
- **Advanced and specialized courses** can draw enrollments from across the state.
- The process is **completely invisible** on the instructional side.
- Outside students wait for “open enrollment,” so **our students enroll first**.
- Access to a “**dashboard**” showing all the SRJC students taking classes at other colleges, and all outside students taking SRJC classes through the Exchange.



WHAT WOULD BE THE CHALLENGES TO JOINING THE EXCHANGE?

- While SRJC students are already using the CVC to enroll in classes at other colleges, it's possible this could increase with more visibility.
- Our IT team would need to spend time working with the CVC-OEI technical staff to integrate with our SIS.
- Some processes, such as Financial Aid verification for students from other CCCs, would still need to be handled manually.
- As we move towards becoming a Teaching College, we will need to discuss the creation of a local Peer Online Course Review (POCR) process.



TO BECOME A HOME COLLEGE

SRJC would need to work with the CVC to integrate our SIS with their course listing system so that seat availability in each online section would become “live” information.

- Colleges are encouraged to get agreement/resolution from:
 - College Cabinet
 - Local Academic Senate
- We would need to work with IT and Distance Education to enable Canvas and SIS integrations
- We would need to sign a CVC Financial Aid Consortium Agreement (requires signature from College President and Financial Aid Director)
- *eTranscripts are required, which we already have in place*

TO BECOME A TEACHING COLLEGE

This requires a deeper level of technical integration as well as coordination with SRJC's Financial Aid and Admissions and Records staff.

To complete this process, SRJC would need to:

- Sign the CVC Consortium Agreement
- Get president-level approval to join a Teaching College cohort.
- Work with IT to integrate live course data at a deeper level
- Enable payment gateway platform provider to integrate online payments with the CVC Exchange
- Attend various technical and process-related training sessions

TO BECOME A CONSORTIUM COLLEGE

SRJC would need to agree to a set of principles, guidelines and data sharing agreements, and commit to becoming a Teaching College in the future.

Becoming a Consortium college is not required to become a Home College, but can be done at the same time.

To complete this process, SRJC would need to:

- Ask the college president to sign a Master Consortium Agreement verifying agreement with Exchange principles and committing to fully participating in the CVC Exchange as a Teaching College at some point in the future.

WHAT STUDENTS SEE

For students at **Home Colleges**, they would go to **CVC.edu**:

1. Search for a course by category
2. Activate any desired filters
3. Find a class with available seats
4. If class is offered at a Teaching College
 - Click ADD CLASS
 - Student's identity is validated, they can pay their fees, and they are instantly enrolled.
5. If class is offered at a non-Teaching College
 - Click APPLY - student is taken to CCCApply for that college
