Correcting the Academic Senate Bylaws

Correcting the Bylaws. Does the Academic Senate approve a correction to the Bylaws as based on the consent item passed on 7 May 2025 entitled [Adoption of Faculty Professional Development Senate Subcommittee Revitalization Recommendations?](#)

As appears under Section 4A: "Composition: At least five members appointed by the Senate. These should include representatives from a variety of disciplines and should include contract and associate faculty. ..."

This differs from what appears in our Bylaws, Article III, Section 4, which states "Composition: At least five members appointed by the Senate. These should include representatives from a variety of disciplines and should include contract and associate faculty and one at-large Senator. ..."

Note that "and one at-large Senator" needs to be struck from our current Bylaws if we wish to be in alignment with the May 7th approved consent item.

Section 4: Faculty Professional Development Committee

A. Composition: At least five faculty members appointed by the Senate. These should include representatives from a variety of disciplines and should include contract and associate faculty. The Faculty Professional Development Coordinator(s) will be appointed by the Senate for two years. **The Staff Development Coordinator will serve as a non-voting ex officio member.**
