Changes to the Constitution

1. Procedure: we decide as a body what changes to make if any. We propose it to the electorate. We ask for a vote, yes or no. 66 % yes means we make the changes.

2. The Changes

- A. Defining the Electorate: Propose
 - i. Contract Electorate: all teaching and allied faculty on contract, regardless of tenure or tenure track (Current List of kinds of faculty is antiquated)
 - ii. Adjunct Electorate: all teaching or allied faculty whose present load is _____

Question: Do we want to be more inclusive and say 20% or go with 40%?

- B. Correcting Areas of Representation: There are in fact 13. Simple correction
- C. Vice-President to Vice President. Simple Correction
- D. President Elected by Electorate, Contract and Adjunct
- E. Term change 1: President may run for reelection in one year increments not to exceed four total consecutive years; So the President's term is a minimum of two and a maximum of four continuous years. The present, at the end of the first year may run for one or two additional years; at the end of the second year, if they have run for a third year (as opposed to a second two-year term), may at that time run for a fourth year. This is current practice.
- F. Term Change 2. The Past President

Option 1: serves for two years (no change)

Option 2: serves for one year with opt-in option of second year in consultation with the current President

Option 3: Serves for two years with an opt-out option of not serving additional year in consultation with current President
