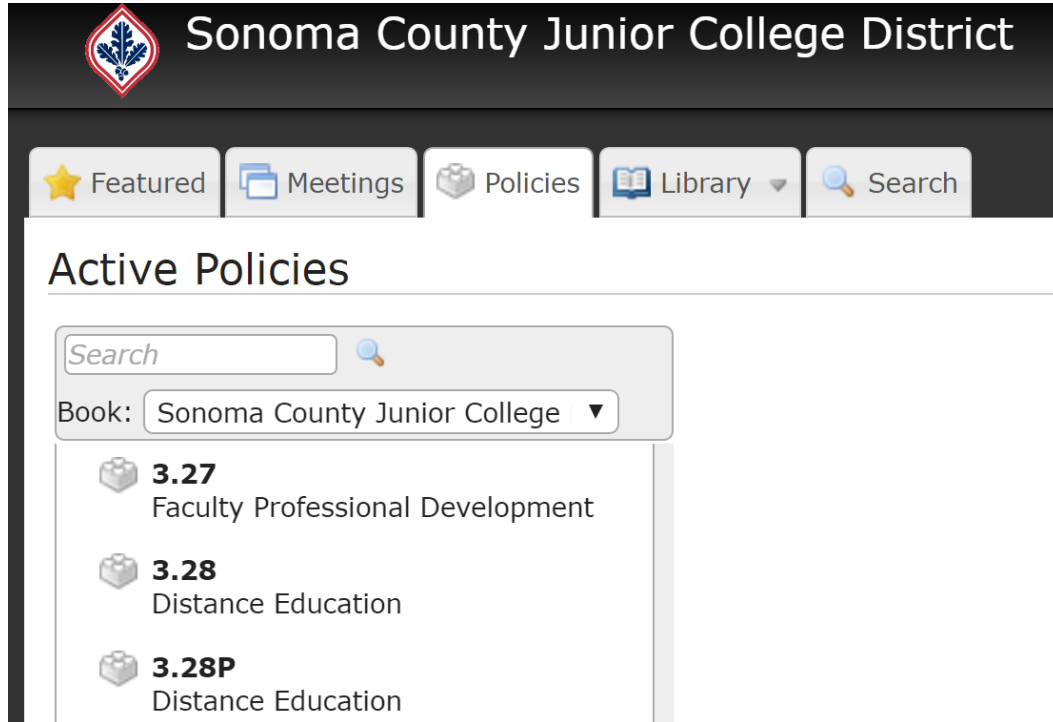

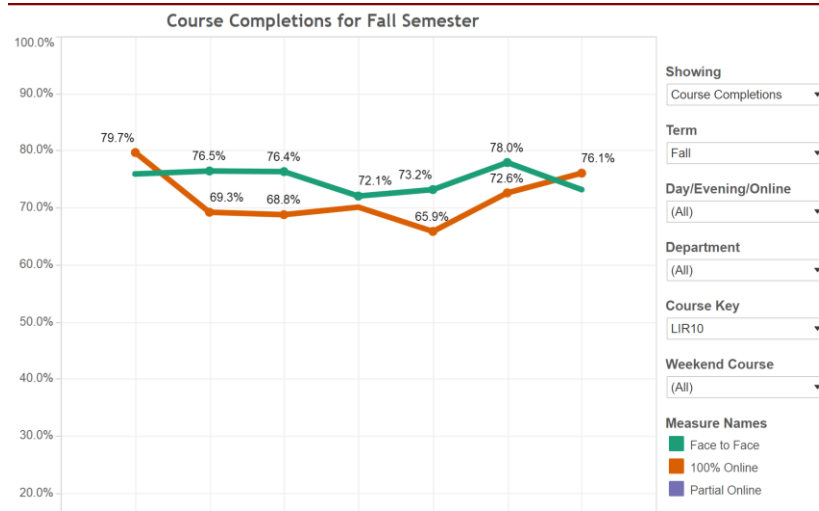

Proctoring Online Classes

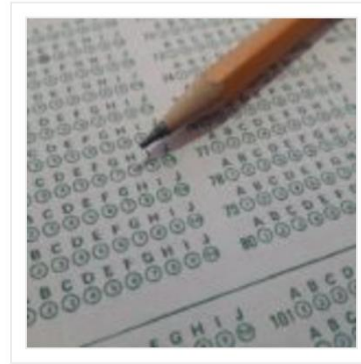
- ▶ Academic Integrity - Board Policy

- ▶ OEI offers discounted rate Proctorio = machine based
- ▶ OEI working on network of F2F proctoring between CCs
- ▶ Maybe Pilot Proctorio at SRJC?

Online Proctoring with Proctorio

The Online Education Initiative (OEI) selected Proctorio as our online academic integrity partner through a competitive proposal process. The Proctorio RFP documents are stored with the Foundation for California Community Colleges College Buys webpage.



F2F CCC Proctoring Network

The Online Education Initiative (OEI) is currently developing a network of participating colleges to accommodate faculty and online learners who need a physical location and in-person proctor for face-to-face examinations.

Dialog about OEI Course Exchange

- ▶ The OEI Course Exchange uses an Opt-In model
- ▶ Current SIS prevents participation
- ▶ DOC recommends District dialog and study of the challenges and opportunities of participation.
- ▶ **Maybe a Senate Formed Task Force?**
- ▶ “Through the Course Exchange, students who cannot get the courses they need at their home college will be able to enroll in them at another college (teaching college) that has available seats in the equivalent course via a streamlined registration process at their home college.”

CVC vs. OEI Course Exchange

CALIFORNIA VIRTUAL CAMPUS (CVC)

- ❖ Lists all higher ed (CCC, CSU, UC private, etc.) online classes in California
- ❖ Data “mined” from colleges (not submitted)
- ❖ Links to college Admissions sites
- ❖ Highlights all DE “competition”
- ❖ Can be sorted by subject, system, ADT, etc.
- ❖ Can be edited and updated by college

OEI COURSE EXCHANGE

- ❖ Only available to Consortium colleges/students
- ❖ Consortium is “opt in”
- ❖ Currently 24 colleges in Consortium (3 “live” with exchange)
- ❖ Exchange and Consortium parameters are guided by participating colleges
- ❖ Courses are vetted through peer review and instructional design process
- ❖ Students can enroll in courses without duplicative/additional application process

The OEI Course Exchange

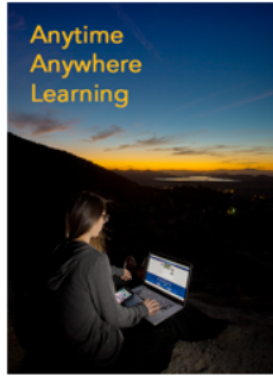


- 3** # of colleges currently exchanging (Fresno, Lake Tahoe, Coastline)
- 8** # of pilot colleges exchanging by end of semester
- 16** # of additional pilot college exchanging by the end of the year
- 2017** Year new colleges will be able to apply to join the exchange (probably mid-year)
- 0** # of people at SRJC who have agreed to apply (our SIS may be a barrier)

Do you need an Additional Class this term?



Are you having trouble finding the courses you need when you need them?

Are you having trouble enrolling in that one necessary prerequisite class semester after semester?

Would completing that one required class help you to speed up your ability to graduate or transfer?

If you answered yes to any of the above questions, then you might want to check out opportunities to enroll in online courses across the California Community College system via the CCC Course Exchange.

Here's how!

1. Check the list of online courses that may be available to you when you have exhausted the available courses at your college: **List of Online Courses.**
2. When you find the class you need, make a note about the title of the course and where it's offered.
3. Register for as many of the courses you need at your home college first.
4. Look for the Course Exchange Link on the screen when you receive confirmation that you have successfully registered at your home college.
