Program Mapping: Why? and Why First?

- **Clarification of Academic Pathways:** Provides students with clear, structured course sequences that guide them
- **Informed Decision-Making:** Students make more informed decisions about their academic journey. Students can see how different courses connect to their career or transfer goals
- **Improved Completion Rates:** Students are more likely to complete their degree or certificate on time.
- **Equity and Access:** Reduces disparities in educational outcomes. Ensures all students have access to the same information and opportunities to succeed

Program Mapping: What SRJC has now

Recommended Course Sequences submitted with curriculum changes

- The RCS includes:
 - All majors and certificates
 - Major requirements (and if courses have pre-req)
 - Displays modality (online, in person, etc.)
 - Displays day vs. evening vs. weekend
 - What semester they are offered
- The RCS **does not**:
 - Display General Education requirements
 - Get well-utilized / Integrated in website /
 - Career information
