SB 1359 (Block D) Public postsecondary education: course materials

This bill would require each campus of the California Community Colleges and the California State University, and would request each campus of the University of California:

- To identify in each published schedule of classes, the estimated total cost of required textbooks and other required educational materials for each course offered by the campus.
- ② Clearly highlight, by means that may include a symbol or logo in a conspicuous place on the online campus course schedule, the courses that exclusively use digital course materials that are free of charge to students and may have a low-cost option for print versions.
- Ourrently, the College Textbook Transparency Act, requires each campus bookstore at any public postsecondary educational institution to post in its store or on its website a disclosure of the retail price policy on new and used textbooks.

Fate of The Bills on The Governors Desk From The Last Report:

AB 2069 (Medina D) Part-time faculty office hours

This bill would require that each community college post on its website part-time office hours and report the number of paid part-time faculty office hours at the college.

Vetoed - Gathering and reporting this information still has a real cost, about 10 percent of the entire allocation of funding for part-time office hours. We would do better to spend the money on more office hours.

AB 2017 (McCarty) College Mental Health Services Program

This bill would appropriate create a program utilizing Proposition 63 funds to create a competitive grant program to fund mental health services at public colleges. Vetoed - While well-intentioned, the bill is premature as it commits to a particular program structure without specifying the amount or source of funding.

AB 1594 (McCarty D) Prohibition of using tobacco and smoking on campuses

This bill would prohibit smoking or e-cigarettes at Californias Community Colleges and the California State University.

Vetoed - Governors message indicated that University and Community College Boards are fully capable of setting smoking policies on their campuses.
