# **Communicating with Constituents:**

- 1. Partner up with the area you represent
- 2. Since each area has two representatives, does your area divide your constituents into groups? If so how? How many departments do you represent?
- 3. Will you assign a representative to certain groups or departments?
- 4. How will you communicate with your cluster?

- B. Once the assignments have been made, each Senator will do the following to ensure that adequate representation is occurring:
- 1. Contact constituents within the <u>first two months</u> and let them know who their representatives are.
- 2. When possible, <u>attend at least one meeting per represented</u> <u>department per semester to report on Senate actions and provide</u> constituents with an opportunity to present their concerns.
- 3. Emphasize that <u>representation requires that constituents</u> play an active role by contacting any of their area representatives or attending Senate meetings to express their concerns at Open Forum.

- B. Once the assignments have been made, each Senator will do the following to ensure that adequate representation is occurring:
- 4. Encourage faculty to play an active role in the <u>committee structure</u> to ensure a more diverse range of input.
- 5. Contact new faculty members within the Senator's constituency to discuss the <u>role of the Senate</u> and promote their involvement in the larger campus community
- 6. Preferably, Senators will send regular <u>electronic reports</u> to the Senator's constituents using the Senate distribution lists. Senators are encouraged to write reports in conjunction with other related areas.
