

SLO Rubric Revision Proposal

Background: In Spring 2023, the Academic Senate approved a rubric to be used to measure SLOs. This is a binary rubric as faculty had only two options of reporting SLO data: either the student met the outcome or the student did not. This rubric was put in place in Spring 2024.

Current situation: After using this rubric for 3 semesters, we have realized that that the binary rubric led to the following unforeseen consequences:

- *Formative and summative assessment:* The binary rubric is an ineffective tool in formative assessment, as the limited granularity does not effectively show improvement. Faculty who use summative assessment will still have that option under the proposed rubric.
- *Options for no submission:* The binary rubric prevents us from having a viable option to report when students did not attempt to complete an assessment.
- *Poor data transfer:* The binary rubric has led to technical complications in the way that Canvas calculates the success rates collected by Insights.

Proposal: SLO Coordinators, in consultation with Distance Education, our Insights Rep, and the SLO Leadership Team, recommend that we adopt the proposed rubric:

Proficient	Competent	In Progress	No submission
Students whose work goes beyond the minimum standard (i.e., graded assignments are A or B)	Students who meet the minimum standard (i.e., graded assignments are C)	Students who have not yet met the minimum standard (i.e., graded assignments are D or F)	Students who did not turn in an assignment
