WHAT IS ZTC?



Zero Textbook Cost classes rely on Open Educational Resources (OER) and other online resources to eliminate textbook costs for students.

A ZTC degree is a degree (certificate or transfer) or program where students have the option to satisfy all their degree requirements using only ZTC courses.



OVERVIEW OF THE PROGRAM

• Phase I:

- \$20,000 awarded to all colleges that apply for the planning phase.
- Seeking full faculty engagement
- Develop work plan for ZTC certificate and associate degree programs implementation after Fall 2024

• Phase 3:

- At most \$180,000 awarded to colleges to implement all or part of the phase I plan.
- This stage is competitive...



PLAN REQUIREMENTS AND GOALS

- The ZTC programs need to be sustainable, the programs should still be able to run after the grant money runs out.
- Prioritize the adoption or adaptation of existing OER before creating new content.
- Ensure materials are accessible.
- Develop degrees that other CCC's can use or adapt.



WHY DO WE WANT TO DO THIS?

- Cost of materials are the second most sited reason students give as to why they drop out of college.
- Textbook costs is an equity issue.
- Having ZTC programs and classes is proven to help with enrollment and retention



WHAT DO WE NEED TO SUCCEED?

For right now:

- We need faculty from a diverse set of disciplines to join the workgroup for phase I.
- We need faculty and departments to be open to participating in ZTC programs.
- We will need input from many different groups; the Administration,
 Counseling, DRD, and the Bookstore, just to name a few.
