- 2. AP7120A Contract Faculty Hiring Procedure (30 min) Questions raised to date include the following:
 - a. How shall the Title V 9+1 rights of students to participate be reflected in the hiring procedures of SRJC contract faculty members? For instance, and as previously discussed...
 - i. Shall Students be included on all contract faculty hiring committees?
 - ii. Does the body wish to require a teaching demonstration or, for allied faculty, a skills demonstration that includes direct student interaction, as a part of all contract faculty hiring committees?
 - b. Does the body wish to continue to support the inclusion of outside contract faculty members on contract faculty hiring committees as appears in both 4.3.2p and AP7210A?
 - c. Does the body wish to reintroduce this aspect from the 2023 proposal: The Screening and Interviewing Committee may choose to rank candidates if desired; if the candidates are ranked, the ranking may be given to the appropriate Vice President(s) or designee(s) in writing, verbally, or after the administrative interviews are conducted.
 - d. What else does the body wish to discuss related to the <u>AP7120A Document (Clean)</u>? Related Resources:
